NORTH CAROLINA STEM & SEL BENCHMARK ALIGNMENT

This document outlines how ReelTime Animal Rescue's Compassion Education: **CONNECT & Inspire** program aligns with the STEM & SEL benchmarks set forth by the North Carolina Department of Education. The program is designed to meet key educational standards through real-time content fostering critical thinking and empathy along with real-world social-emotional skills.

STEM Benchmarks Alignment

GRADES: K-2 (Standards: K.L.1, K.E.1, 1.L.2, 2.L.1)

Benchmark: Identify animal needs and explore how living things change. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Students witness real animals receiving food, water, and shelter in sanctuaries.
- Observations lead to discussions about life cycles and human responsibility.
- Drawing, journaling, and class dialogue enhance inquiry-based learning.

GRADES: 3-5 (Standards: 3.L.2, 4.L.1, 5.L.2)

Benchmark: Understand adaptations, ecosystems, and energy flow. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Students examine survival strategies and symbiotic relationships in sanctuary settings.
- · Lessons involve diagramming food webs and ethical decision-making
- Educators integrate social responsibility into STEM exploration.

GRADES: 6-8 (Standards: 6.L.2, 7.L.1, 8.E.1)

Benchmark: Analyze biotic and abiotic interactions and environmental issues. Compassion Education Alignment:

- Students explore pollution, habitat destruction, and species recovery through sanctuary case studies.
- · Projects include data collection, hypothesis generation, and ethical proposals.
- · Content encourages systems thinking and civic engagement.

GRADES: 9-12 (Standards: Bio.2.1, Bio.2.2, EEn.2.5, EEn.2.8)

Benchmark: Examine ecosystem dynamics and human environmental impact. Compassion Education Alignment:

- Teens investigate deforestation, species extinction, and conservation efforts.
- · Assignments include solution design, research projects, and science communication.
- · Lessons blend emotional intelligence with scientific literacy and advocacy.

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GRADES: K-2

- · Students witness real animals receiving food, water, and shelter in sanctuaries.
- · Observations lead to discussions about life cycles and human responsibility.

GRADES: 3-5

- Empathy: Children learn to understand and care about others' needs, including animals.
- Ethical Reasoning: Students analyze scenarios and reflect on fairness and consequences.

GRADES: 6-8

- Personal Values: Students explore their role in solving real-world problems.
- Conflict Resolution: Rescue stories spark conversations about compassion and responsibility.

GRADES: 9–12

- · Purpose & Advocacy: Learners become champions for change using knowledge and compassion.
- Collaborative Leadership: Teens lead projects and discussions on humane and ecological topics.
