OREGON STEM & SEL BENCHMARK ALIGNMENT

This document outlines how ReelTime Animal Rescue's Compassion Education: **CONNECT & Inspire** program aligns with the STEM & SEL benchmarks set forth by the Oregon Department of Education. The program is designed to meet key educational standards through real-time content fostering critical thinking and empathy along with real-world social-emotional skills.

STEM Benchmarks Alignment

GRADES: K-2 (Standards: K-LS1-1, 1-LS3-1, 2-LS4-1)

Benchmark: Observe and describe what animals need to survive and where they live. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Students view animals in sanctuaries receiving food, water, and medical attention.
- Livestreams and teacher-led inquiry enhance curiosity about natural habitats.
- · Students journal, draw, and discuss humane treatment and kindness toward animals.

GRADES: 3-5 (Standards: 3-LS4-3, 4-LS1-1, 5-LS2-1)

Benchmark: Understand biodiversity, systems, and animal adaptations. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Students examine how sanctuaries simulate natural environments and support recovery.
- · Projects include analyzing food chains, modeling ecosystems, and ethical roleplay.
- · Compassion Education promotes interdisciplinary STEM learning.

GRADES: 6-8 (Standards: MS-LS2-1 to MS-LS2-5, MS-ESS3-3)

Benchmark: Evaluate ecosystems, sustainability, and human impact. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Real-time case studies reveal how human behavior affects animal welfare and biodiversity.
- Students work on solution-focused environmental proposals and resilience planning.
- Content builds scientific analysis, systems thinking, and ethical literacy.

GRADES: 9–12 (Standards: HS.LS2.6, HS.ESS3.4, HS.ETS1.3)

Benchmark: Apply systems thinking to complex environmental and biological challenges. Compassion Education Alignment:

- Teens evaluate rescue models and propose scalable conservation solutions.
- · Projects incorporate research, media literacy, and compassionate science communication.
- · Students learn to bridge emotional intelligence with technical knowledge.

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GRADES: K-2

- Self-Expression: Students identify feelings sparked by animal stories.
- · Empathy Practice: Livestreams show real examples of care and rescue.

GRADES: 3-5

- Ethical Reasoning: Children consider the "why" behind kindness and protection.
- · Team-Based Learning: Collaboration fosters belonging and mutual respect.

GRADES: 6-8

- Perspective-Taking: Learners evaluate diverse animal and human experiences.
- · Self-Discovery: Students reflect on personal purpose and ethical values.

GRADES: 9–12

- · Compassionate Advocacy: Teens lead service-based projects, media campaigns, or presentations.
- · Civic Responsibility: Lessons build real-world leadership with heart and purpose.
