WISCONSIN STEM & SEL BENCHMARK ALIGNMENT

This document outlines how ReelTime Animal Rescue's Compassion Education: **CONNECT & Inspire** program aligns with the STEM & SEL benchmarks set forth by the Wisconsin Department of Education. The program is designed to meet key educational standards through real-time content fostering critical thinking and empathy along with real-world social-emotional skills.

STEM Benchmarks Alignment

GRADES: K-2 (SEP 1-8)

Benchmark: Observe and ask questions about the natural world. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Livestreams of animal rescues encourage students to ask why and how.
- Young learners connect to real-world science by seeing animals' needs met.
- · Educators use the content for storytelling, classification, and basic cause/effect.

GRADES: 3-5 (SEP 1-8, SCI.LS2.5.E)

Benchmark: Develop models and identify patterns in living systems. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Students identify relationships between organisms and their environments.
- · Rescue footage provides examples of food chains, adaptation, and survival strategies.
- · Projects include building models of habitats and predicting animal behavior.

GRADES: 6-8 (SCI.LS2.6.M, SCI.ESS3.6.M, SEP 1-8)

Benchmark: Analyze the effect of human activity on ecosystems. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Middle school students examine biodiversity loss and ethical animal treatment.
- · Students engineer solutions to habitat destruction and propose care strategies.
- · Lessons focus on data analysis, persuasive presentation, and conservation impact.

GRADES: 9-12 (SCI.ENV.9-12.A-F, SCI.LS2.9-12.A, SEP 1-8)

Benchmark: Use models and scientific evidence to explore global systems and ethics. Compassion Education Alignment:

- · Students conduct authentic research based on real-time animal rescue scenarios.
- · Learners evaluate ethical dimensions of environmental decisions.
- Capstone projects include community education campaigns and global comparisons.

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GRADES: K-2

- · Empathy: Students connect emotionally with animals through daily interactions.
- · Positive Behavior: Kindness is reinforced through example and discussion.

GRADES: 3-5

- Perspective-Taking: Students consider the feelings and experiences of rescued animals.
- Ethical Choices: Learners reflect on what it means to be responsible caretakers.

GRADES: 6-8

- Peer Collaboration: Students work together on rescue-themed design and research.
- Resilience & Voice: SEL is integrated with advocacy and action.

GRADES: 9-12

- · Leadership: Students use compassion as a guide to influence their community.
- Agency: Teens develop self-awareness and purpose-driven engagement.
